

As a professor of international security studies at an institution (CFC) you will recognize, as one who follows UN developments closely and as a proud Canadian who had the opportunity to meet you when you served as the Canadian ambassador to the UN, I am pleased to be asked to convey the following news to you.

Sri Chinmoy, the eminent spiritual teacher who has devotely served the UN for over three decades, would like to award you the Lifting-Up the World With a Oneness-Heart Award. Sri Chinmoy deeply respects and admires your work for the UN since you became Deputy Secretary-General in 1998.
