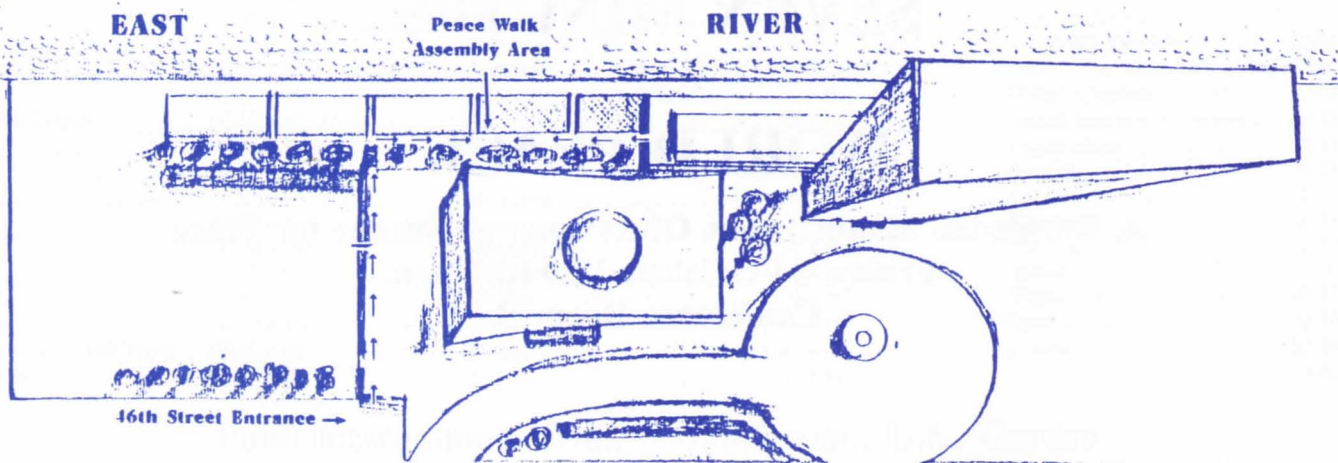

SEVEN MINUTES OF WORLD PEACE

Join the United Nations Headquarters observance
of a global, simultaneous seven minutes of silence for peace on:

UNITED NATIONS DAY
Friday, 24 October 1986
1:00-1:07 p.m. — Conference Room B
(Please arrive by 12:55 p.m.)

Individuals, groups and organizations in countries around the world will maintain silence to experience the spirit of peace on earth during the local times corresponding to 17:00-17:07 Greenwich Mean Time (GMT). This observance, now in its third year, offers people in every country an opportunity to transcend their individual and national identities and join all humanity in absolute peace as part of one human family. Governments of all countries are being requested to refrain from warlike action during the Seven Minutes of World Peace observance.

PAST OBSERVANCES

Seven Minutes of World Peace was inaugurated in 1984 with the participation of groups in over 40 countries. In 1985, interest in the event grew and messages of support were received from several heads of state. Perhaps the largest observance was in Sri Lanka, where over 1,000 school children, teachers and members of the public gathered in the city of Panadura for seven minutes of silent prayer and meditation under the guidance of officials and clergy from the main faiths of Sri Lanka. This year, the United Nations Association there is planning to send 15,000 letters to institutions in the country calling for participation in the event. In the United States and Canada, 75 cities proclaimed 24 October as World Peace Day last year in connection with this project.
